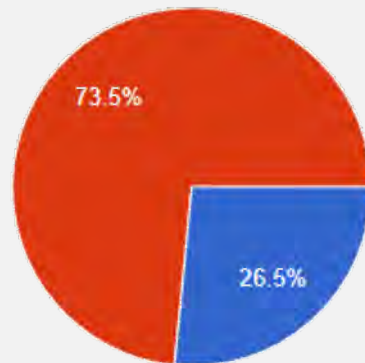
# Questionnaire to students

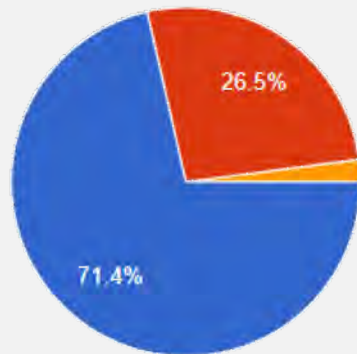

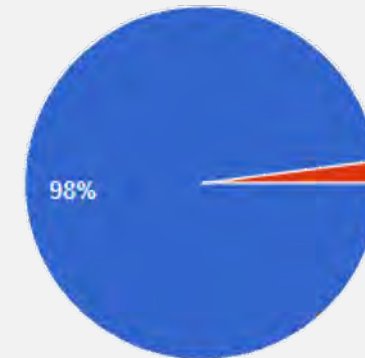
The universal language in science is English

International mobility is an important component of scientific research.

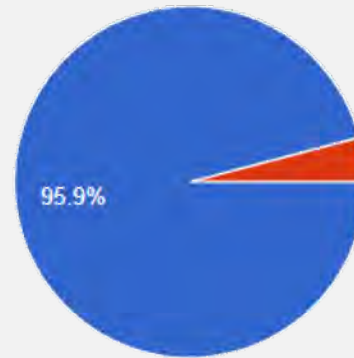

The use of model organisms, such as the fruit fly or zebra fish, allows us to build relevant knowledge for society.

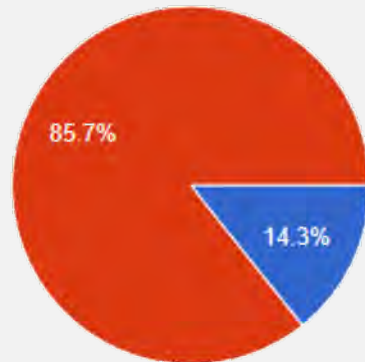

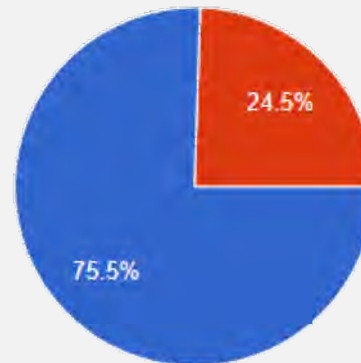
Only exceptionally intelligent people are able to conduct scientific research.

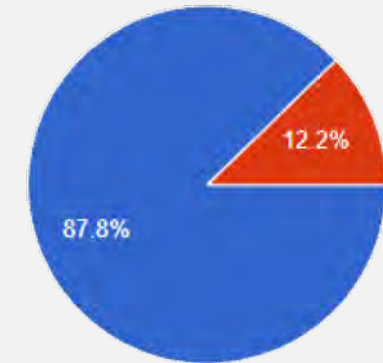
I can imagine myself doing research in experimental sciences.

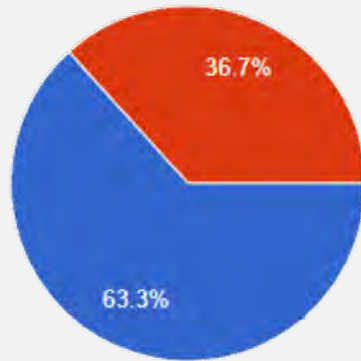
There are as many men as women choosing scientific careers.

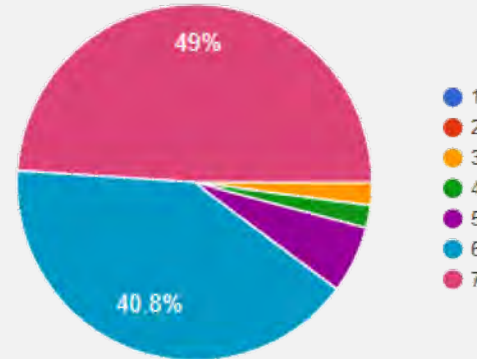


# Evaluation of the event – by the students
